(December 19, 2022) – Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Green Bay and Lakes Country Public Library are pleased to announce that they have developed a tele-services program to provide mental health counseling, financial counseling, immigration assistance, and adoption assistance to the Lakewood and surrounding rural areas. The program will give area residents the ability to schedule time at the Lakes County Library in a private room and link directly to a skilled counselor at the Catholic Charities offices. “We are very excited to be working with Lakes Country Public Library,” states Karmen Lemke, Director of Catholic Charities. “By providing direct access to these services, people do not have to drive or worry if they don’t have a strong Internet connection in their home. We are also very grateful to the Library and the visionary leadership by its Board.” An Open House is being planned for February 6th at the Library.
