A CLOSER LOOK AT CATHOLIC CHARITIES

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Green Bay traces its origins to 1915 when Bishop Paul Peter Rhode encouraged the Catholic laity to assist Catholic people in need through a social service delivery system. In 1918, in consultation with the seven pastors in the city of Green Bay, the agency structure was formally organized and the Green Bay Diocese Apostolate was established. Since the beginning, the organization has been known by three different names: The Green Bay Diocese Apostolate, Catholic Social Services, and its current name — Catholic Charities.

CHILD AND FAMILY

Catholic Charities provides domestic infant, intercountry, relative and stepparent adoption services. Our services are guided by Matthew 18:5, "And anyone who welcomes a little child like this on my behalf is welcoming me." Our staff assists expectant parents with creating an adoption plan that respects their decision to choose life and prepares prospective adoptive parents to welcome a child to their family through adoption. Additional services include support and education to birth parents, adoptive parents and adoptees throughout the adoption process as well as post adoption.

FINANCIAL HEALTH

Many individuals and families in our community live in poverty. Through our Financial Health services clients are given the tools they need to make sound decisions about resources and set new financial goals to help them take the steps to get out of poverty. This program also assists those who are looking at possible foreclosure or bankruptcy giving the client alternative options that they may not have been aware of previously.

COUNSELING

When life has become overwhelming and thoughts turn dark, many individuals have turned to our Mental Health Services, which provide professional individual, family and marriage counseling. Regardless of ability to pay, our services can offer hope and help so that people enjoy the fullness of life God has given.

REFUGEE AND IMMIGRAN

We are called to welcome the stranger. Many refugee and immigrant families with no place to turn become engaged in our services in adjustment of legal status, refugee resettlement and support that helps them become self-sufficient.

LIVING JUSTICE ADVOCACY

Catholic Charities serves the needs of the community by raising awareness about issues of injustice and attacks on human dignity, and applies the wisdom of the Church to these issues. By sharing our faith in Jesus Christ and the principles of Catholic Social Teaching, we strive to inspire people to develop creative and lifegiving responses to injustice in our community – locally, nationally and globally. Through education, advocacy and communication, we collaborate with parishes, schools and community groups to elevate the voices of the marginalized and to address the systemic issues that contribute to injustice in our society.
