Raised record proceeds of \$152,745 at our 10th annual "Inspired to Act" event, an important part of funding our mission.



Partnered with Catholic Charities USA on the "We Are There" national branding campaign. This represents our commitment to be present in the lives of those in need and meet people where they are in life's journey.



Established a major presence in On Mission magazine, a new offering from the diocesan Office of Communications & Marketing that reaches +90,000 households. We also launched "Catholic Charities Corner" in On Mission's weekly e-newsletter.



Expanded our reach to the Manitowoc area by adding a third virtual care "kiosk," serving more people in rural areas who would otherwise have barriers to services.



Grew our school-based mental health program from two to three locations, serving our Catholic schools in rural communities.



Participated in the National Eucharistic Revival & Pilgrimage by hosting a community service project for the pilgrims and local volunteers during it's time in our diocese.

"Rosa was in an extremely abusive relationship with her husband, so bad that she had to flee from her apartment. Luckily, she was able to find refuge in a local domestic violence shelter and was referred to us for immigration legal services as a victim of domestic violence. Our staff assisted her through the 'U visa' process for crime victims, and she is now able to work and support herself as a lawful permanent resident."

"When a client's mortgage was sold to a new company requesting substantial additional payments for 12 months, we recognized the financial hardship this would cause and crunched the numbers. Finding a lesser amount over 16 months that would prevent any escrow shortages, the client was able to negotiate with the mortgage company and establish a new payment plan that allowed her to maintain financial stability."




