Latest Happenings in the Diocese

Adoration Against Trafficking

During the three days of the NFL Draft (April 24– 26), Catholics from across the diocese gathered at Resurrection Catholic Parish in Allouez to pray for an end to human trafficking. Thank you to all who participated and stood in solidarity through prayer for this

Legislative Advocacy

Catholic Charities' human dignity and life advocate, Lucas Holt, attended a public hearing hosted by the state legislature's Joint Committee on Finance as it seeks to put together a budget for FY 2025-27. Holt testified in support of expanding postpartum care for women on Medicaid from 2 months



to 12 months; and for returning 17 year-olds to the juvenile justice system.

Artificial Intelligence: Principles and Priorities

On June 9, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops issued a letter to members of Congress on artificial intelligence. The letter highlights that AI must serve humanity, and not the other way around.

Pope Leo XIV has also stressed the importance of placing humanity at the center of discussions surrounding the use of AI. In his first formal address as the Successor of St. Peter, he explained to the college of cardinals one of his reasons for choosing the name 'Leo': "There are different reasons for this, but mainly because Pope Leo XIII in his historic Encyclical *Rerum Novarum* addressed the social question in the context of the first great industrial revolution. In our own day, the Church offers to everyone the treasury of her social teaching in response to another industrial revolution and to developments in the field of artificial intelligence that pose new challenges for the defence of human dignity, justice and labour."
